FOAC Legislative Report for October 7th, 2025 and the Weeks Prior... :: Firearms Owners

Against Crime ILLEA by James Stoker As President, it is important for me that members understand what actions were taken to combat the press for gun control bills in the PA. House of Representatives this past week. I know sometimes the communication drops to calls to action and alerts. The two weeks leading up the running of the bills on the floor, we took steps to combat the bills with our House Judiciary Committee representatives, up to and including presenting pages worth of talking points to oppose the bills. The anti-gun Democrat leadership wasted no time in putting them on the calendar for September 29th, 2025. Not having a budget done apparently wasn't as important as tyranny that week. But now I have become convinced the votes are all party line and the fates of these bills all but predetermined. Anti-gunners didn't take long promoting the next step in the gameplan by immediately pushing out House Bill 1891 – Modernizing Records of Firearms Sales, which we could also call “Forcing Electronic Filing to Enhance Accuracy of the State Gun Registry”.

Pennsylvania Court Just Took a Gun Control Tactic Off the Table by Cam Edwards While outright bans on gun shops are also on thin legal ground, we've seen multiple communities around the country enact restrictive zoning laws that make it difficult, if not impossible, for FFLs to find a place where they can do business. In Pennsylvania, Lower Merion Township has adopted that strategy. It passes a zoning ordinance limiting gun shops to just four zoning districts, but also subjected FFLs to twelve different “conditional use” criteria. Though Pennsylvania has a firearms preemption law that prohibits localities from adopting their own gun control laws, Lower Merion Township maintains that these are *zoning* laws, not gun control ordinances, and therefore don't implicate or run afoul of the preemption statute. After the township was sued by Firearms Owners Against Crime-Institute for Legislative and Legal Educational Action and a local FFL, a trial court determined that many of those criteria, were, in fact, gun regulations. Now a Commonwealth Court panel has delivered the last blow to the zoning ordinances, declaring that *all* of them are firearms regulations, no zoning regulations.

Federal Judge: Biden ATF Rule on Firearms Sales Cannot Be Used Against NRA Members

AWR Hawkins On Tuesday, U.S. District Court Judge Corey L. Maze “Permanently [blocked] federal authorities from enforcing multiple provisions of the ATF's [‘engaged in the business’

rule], according to Rocket City Now. Maze’s ruling applies to two plaintiffs – “Don Butler of Talladega and David Glidewell of Ragland” – and the members of the NRA.

Federal Court Says Post Office Carry Prohibition Unconstitutional *John Petrolino* Chief United States District Judge Reed O’Connor wrote that the law “is unconstitutional under the Second Amendment with respect to Plaintiffs’ (and their members) possession and carrying of firearms inside of an ordinary United States Post Office or the surrounding Post Office property.” There’s nothing in the order limiting it to Texas and applies to all members of the Second Amendment Foundation and Firearms Policy Coalition.
