Legislative & FOAC Reports:

Trump DOJ Adding ‘Second Amendment Rights Section’ by: *AWR Hawkins* President Donald Trump’s Department of Justice (DOJ) is adding a “Second Amendment Rights Section” to its Civil Rights Division – this is a very good thing – The National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF) reported that the creation of the “Second Amendment Rights Section” is “a historical course correction in federal policy and highlights the Trump Administration’s continued effort to assess ongoing infringements on the Second Amendment rights.” NSSF added: ...The Civil Rights Division now has an institutional home for cases in which state or local officials abuse licensing and permitting authority to deny ordinary citizens their rights. DOJ has already shown it is willing to investigate jurisdictions accused of slow-walking concealed carry approvals and imposing excessive fees and delays after *Bruen*. The new office is designed to expand that work and give gun owners, retailers and shooting ranges somewhere to turn to when their rights are targets through back-door regulation.

FOAC November Meeting: Discussed the Current Legislative Issues and Legal Actions around the State. Just a few 10.2 FOAC v Harrisburg – Commonwealth Court requested oral argument on December 8th – 4 ordinances were thrown out, 1 was not, Harrisburg Appealed; 10.3 Pa. State Museum – Formally complained at PMHC meeting Sept. 19th, 2024. No response yet. Hoping for meeting with the AG. Pending AG initiatives. AG can’t action preemption unless county DA invites them; 10.10 Lawrence County Sheriff – Requiring references. Pending Sheriffs’ Association Intervention.
