Legislative & FOAC Reports:

- **ATF Moves to Cut Fingerprint, Photo Requirements for NFA Gun Owners:** *by John Crump*; The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) unveiled a new proposal rule that would simplify the process of acquiring National Firearms Act (NFA) firearms. The ATF filed a notice of proposed rulemaking in the Federal Registry today. The rule is titled “Fingerprint and Photograph Requirements for Firearms Applications” [Docket No. ATF-2026-0397; ATF 2025R-14P]. It modifies 27 CFR parts 478 and 479 to reduce burdens on the American gun-owning population by removing several key requirements for filing ATF Forms 4 and 1. Currently, when a gun owner submits an NFA form to the ATF, they must submit two fingerprint cards and a 2”x2” photo, similar to a passport photo. The proposed rule will change that. NFA applicants no longer need to provide two separate fingerprint cards. This reduces the number to a single card. The real change will apply to NFA trust applicants. The proposed rule removes the fingerprinting requirement entirely, meaning if someone uses a trust, they will not be required to submit fingerprints. This change is limited to customers with NFA trusts because of federal statutes. Individuals and trust holders will no longer need to submit passport photos. They will be able to prove their identity with a scan or photo of a government-issued ID. This change will eliminate the burden on gun owners to have to seek out a place to get their pictures taken. The ATF believes the change will not affect public safety and will help it achieve its goal of being less burdensome to the American public regarding the right to keep and bear arms. Gun owners and pro-gun organizations should make their voices heard through the comment process. With this new rule, the injunctions over the Virginia “assault weapons” ban, the Department of Justice suing Virginia over the ban and California over its Glock ban, and the Supreme Court granting certiorari in a couple of “assault weapon” ban cases, it has not been a good week for anti-gun zealots.

 - JRs are treated well we should have them put a little “skin” in the game by having them clean up after there shoots to help support themselves, scrap brass is going for \$60 a 5 gal bucket – Addressed that the JRs do clean up their brass and the

brass around them on the Combat range after each shoot – req that we place it in a separate bucket

- New members go through orientation on the range for dos and don't but there are some members that may never have any training. That's whereas a club it's our responsibility to make sure everyone is acting in a safe manor while on the property and to bring to their attention the safe way to handle firearms. – was just discussed in the Eboard meeting about putting a video together with a sheet that says that they watched the video for not just new members but for all members. This would go through the members only portal of the club website, and next month Mark will go over how to join for those who haven't and if anyone doesn't have a computer or is technology savvy then mark will help them with that.
- As a reminder this is not my club – his club – her club – but “OUR” club. And with group effort, we can keep it a place everyone wants to keep coming back to by volunteering to help keep the place groomed and clean, rather than waiting for someone else to do it
